

In 2022, revised and retitled, "The Kiss" made the BC Writer's Literary Contest Longlist for Creative Nonfiction. Recently, "Scar Tissue" (retitled once more by the publisher) appeared in the April 2024 edition of Dorothy Parker's Ashes, a New York literary magazine. Since publication, the story has finally come to rest peacefully.

This past year included additional personal writing milestones: publishing with CBC and the Globe and Mail. My First-Person columns are <u>here</u> along with other recent publications.
